It would be difficult to try to encourage someone in a deeper spiritual way without this close walk. Second, you should maintain a life of good behavior and attitude towards authority. The Lord is pleased with us as we submit to one another in the fear of the Lord!

## QUALIFICATIONS

- If a counselor: at least 18 years of age, some allowances may be made in cases of exceptional maturity.
- Born again growing Christian, spiritually mature, maintaining a consistent devotional life
- Good moral character and integrity, emotionally mature
- Good health and vitality
- A love for children, a desire to reach out to them with understanding and good judgment. An ability to put the children's needs ahead of your own.
- Ability to work as a team member, a sensitivity to the needs of other workers.
- Understanding and willingness to work toward the achievement of the Camp Mission Statement and Philosophy
- Willingness to submit to authority
- Participation in staff meetings when called upon

## SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES FOR COUNSELORS

- Live with a group of 4-6 campers in tents, helping them to grow and adjust to their new environment
- Help each camper to develop in the four areas of life; physically, spiritually, emotionally and socially
- Lead the group in Bible Lessons, available to share the way of salvation
- Guide the individual camper in participation in group and camp activities
- Be an example in behavior at all times
- Supervise campers in gratis work, activities, shower and swim times
- Teach or assist in one of the camp skills
- Ensure safety and good health practices
- Ensure that camp policy and rules are followed
- Fill out and turn in counseling cards

## **CAMP LITTLE RED MISSION STATEMENT**

To use the camp experience as an opportunity for the salvation and discipleship of individuals toward maturity in Christ and to minister to the total person of each camper and staff member physically, mentally, socially and spiritually while having fun.

## **CAMP LITTLE RED PHILOSOPHY**

To provide twenty four hour living in a group setting in a wilderness type environment with qualified leadership, that we may reach our goal for each camper - THROUGH LEARNING SKILLS AND SOCIAL INTERACTION, WE AIM TO DEVELOP A HEALTHY SELF-ESTEEM WITH A CHRIST-LIKE PERSPECTIVE.

## **OBJECTIVES**

- A) Committed to operating and maintaining a wilderness type camp free from unnecessary distractions.
  - 1. wilderness in main part of Camp
  - 2. multifaceted outdoor activities
  - 3. continued use of outhouses
  - 4. use of tents for accommodation
- B) Preserve the God-provided beauty and not destroy the ecology of camp through
  - 1. teaching
  - 2. example
  - 3. following camp rules
- C) Keep camps small and personal to better minister to the kids and to have quality rather than quantity.
- D) Secure the best counselors, staff and speakers that will be a positive influence on the campers.
- E) Ensure that each individual has opportunity to hear, understand, and have freedom to make a choice regarding the claims of the Lord Jesus Christ in the Word of God.
- F) Teach skills and conduct activities in a way that promotes accomplishment and participation.
- G) Maintain a family style atmosphere where campers and staff can be comfortable and be themselves.
- H) Promote positive relationships with parents and guardians.
- I) Maintain high standards and safety in all areas
- J) Keep focus on serving the campers.**

## **DOCTRINE**

In your application form that you sent to the camp there was a brief six point Statement of Faith to sign. The camp has a little more detailed Statement of Faith and here it is below. We understand the differences in people's doctrine and want to be upfront in what we believe and teach. If you vary from these teachings than perhaps an interview with the Director is in order. We need to be likeminded believers working together under the banner of The Lord Jesus Christ and His Written Word to be an effective team.

## **STATEMENT OF FAITH**

We believe in:

1. THE DIVINE VERBAL INSPIRATION AND DIVINE PRESERVATION OF THE BIBLE; its absolute infallibility, its supremacy and efficacy in all matters of faith and conduct.
2. GOD, EXISTING ETERNALLY A TRINITY, one, and only one, living and true God in three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.
3. THE LORD JESUS CHRIST, His deity, His miraculous virgin birth, His sinless life, his substitutionary death, His bodily resurrection, His ascension into heaven in the flesh and His intercession there for the saints.
4. THE HOLY SPIRIT in deity, personality and power, and in His work of enlightenment, regeneration, sanctification, and glorification of believers.
5. GOD'S DIRECT CREATION OF MAN in innocence, his fall through disobedience, his total depravity and inability to be saved through his own efforts.
6. THE SALVATION OF SINNERS by grace alone through the mediatorial work of our Lord Jesus Christ, who by His one substitutionary sacrifice, and by His shed blood satisfies the claims of divine justice, and provides for complete atonement and forgiveness of all sins: and that this becomes effective to those who personally receive Christ by faith.
7. THE ABSOLUTE NECESSITY OF REGENERATION as the initial step of salvation; and that when a person is born again by the Holy Spirit he has eternal life and the assurance of salvation.
8. THE ENDUEMENT WITH THE HOLY SPIRIT for service, to be received by faith; and that the gifts and the fruits of the Spirit are necessary to dynamic Christian service.
9. THE SEPARATION OF BELIEVERS from worldly and sinful practices and unto Christ as Lord to provide for a life of godly influence and service.
10. MARRIAGE: that it is ordained by God; that the physical union of man and woman as husband and wife is undefiled; and that all other physical unions are against the will of God and that those who partake thereof are in danger of God's wrath.
11. WITNESSING the gospel of Christ to all the world both by word and by life, and that this is the obligation of every believer.
12. THE PERSONAL SECOND COMING OF CHRIST, first to receive His church in rapture at His appearing; then later to the earth to establish His millennial reign.
13. THE RESURRECTION OF THE DEAD: the just at Christ's second advent and the unjust at the end of the millennial reign.
14. THE ETERNAL DESTINY OF THE SAVED AND OF THE LOST: the believing righteous to be taken with Christ into heavenly glory and the unbelieving wicked to be taken with the devil into hell and finally cast into the lake of fire.

## **PROGRAM**

In this years program there will be a few changes from previous years. The following is an attempt to let you know what to expect before you come. Of course this will be enhanced at our counseling training week.

## **BASIC RUNDOWN**

Your housing as a counselor will be in a canvas 12' x 14' x 5' wall tent put up over a wood platform constructed of treated 2 by 4's and treated ply- wood. A tent structure covers the tent to protect against weather. Other staff will be housed either in cabins or extra tents.

The counselor will have 4-6 campers in their tent group, which will be their responsibility for the duration of the camp. At 7.30 AM there will be a staff meeting. At this meeting we get an encouragement from God's Word and prayer. We discuss issues, campers, scheduling, concerns, problems and what- ever else would be on the mind of the staff.

The campers are waked up at 8.00 for the day. Before breakfast we at times have a morning watch. The Canadian Flag will then be raised and the country prayed for and we will have fun exercises.

After breakfast as well as other meals we will be having a time called Gratis. This is where we will work in groups to do dishes or other jobs needing to be done. We then have one of our two chapel periods usually held in the main building. After this chapel time is a couple of skill periods that will take us to lunch.

There are seven main skills at camp, which consist of Biking, Water Sports, Archery, Wall, Horsemanship, Odds & Ends, Hosh Posh and Survival. The counseling staff will be assigned to teach these skills.

After the lunch and gratis will be a store time and something traditionally called at camp "Bible Delights". This is a Bible discussion-study time with your tent group that lasts from 30- 60 minutes. This time is followed by a variety of activities from swim- ming to wide games to showers. The Program Director will keep us all busy. It is also during this time that some counselor's will have time off to rest.

After supper and gratis we will be going into an silly hour where the campers will choose between a number of electives that will be run by most of the staff. There will be choices varying from drama to sports or from crafts and sketching to hiking and fire building. The Silly Hour will be done 1-3 times during a camp. Other nights we will have games. If you have a particular skill for this time than indicate this to the Director or Program Director so that they can use you in your area of expertise.

After the elective are snack, game, and chapel and finally bed. There are probably a whole bunch of details missing but now you have the inklings of the daily program. We usually run no skills on a Sunday to give everything a rest.

Flexibility is a great quality of a counselor. Someone once said to me that we are suppose to be ready at all times to preach, pray or die. At camp we need to be ready to preach, teach, pray, cry, do a skit, do a skill we don't like, eat that meal even if it's....., help, love, care.... whatever the Lord would have you to do.

## **HELPFUL HINTS FOR THE VILLAGE COUNSELOR**

### **LIVING ACCOMMODATIONS**

You will be living in tents that have a wooden platform that you will be sleeping on. Please bring a good cot or foamie that you can sleep on for the summer. One year a guy brought his mattress from his twin bed. We would recommend whatever bedding base you bring that it leaves enough room for the rest of your group to live comfortably.

### **CLOTHING**

Bring extra clothing and blankets, woollen if possible as nights and rainy spells are cold. Extra footwear, heavy socks and rubber boots, an old pair of runners for swimming. You might enjoy having an old light winter coat handy. One year in early August we had -6C. It was cold! Be very prepared for camps. If need be....we will allow the use of the washer and dryer at camp for getting things clean.

### **WILDERNESS CARE**

As camp goes on there will be a temptation to cheat off a trail or go where you should not go. If everyone did what he or she wanted then the little bit of nature we have will be trampled and un-nice. So your alertness with keeping the vegetation from being destroyed would be a big help. We would ask this be done in an encouraging way.

### **PHONE AND VISITOR PRIVILEGES**

The phone is there and can be used by the staff at anytime. Please don't abuse the privilege. Do not allow the campers to use the phone. The Director or whomever he appoints must give clearance.

Visitors are welcome. If you have someone coming to visit then inform the Director so he can arrange your charge to be taken care of. We have a "Campers First" mentality at camp but strive for a balance of welcoming all through the gates of the camp.

### **HIGH TECH STUFF**

We realize that even in this wilderness setting there will be the possibilities of electronic equipment showing up. We would ask that you keep microwaves, radios, walkman's, iPod's and the like away from the camp. Even Gameboys, Cell phones, Digital Camera's and such are discouraged. In other words don't bother bringing them and **KEEP THEM CELLPHONES OFF**. Cell phones are not allowed to be used as alarm clocks. Campers bringing these things will have them taken till the end of camp. Also there will be no loud music played out of vehicles and other such things that the director does not want.

### **UP-FRONT AND PERSONAL**

The most important part of being a counselor at Camp Little Red is your walk with God. Our Lord doesn't ask us to be holy; he demands it of us. This walk with God that you have ought to be the top priority in your life. It matters not if you are a great archer or can canoe the Amazon. (even though the Little Red is a formidable challenge) No, it matters not if you can climb the highest wall or ride the wildest horse! What matters is your walk with God. This will determine who Jesus Christ is to the campers. Therefore, we must look at a few character traits that we expect you the counselor to exemplify. Does this mean you have to be perfect? No, of course not, but we must remember that Jesus told his disciples to be perfect even as his Father was

perfect. So, even though we don't expect perfection we do expect you the camp worker to be in process; that is, making an effort in your life to strive for perfection.

We need to seek to be like the Father. Well, what does this have to do with counseling or working with campers? About everything! You see, the Bible tells us about the most important things in life in Jeremiah 9:23-24. "Thus saith the Lord, Let not the wise man glory in his wisdom, neither let the mighty man glory in his might, let not the rich man glory in his riches: But let him that glorieth glory in this, that he understandeth and knoweth me, that I am the Lord which exercise lovingkindness, judgment, and righteousness, in the earth; for in these things I delight saith the Lord."

Even though this verse is from the Old King James Version it still comes across very clear. Our most important task in all of life is to know God. We get to know Him through walking with Him. We walk with Him by spending time with Him. We spend time to get to know Him by getting into the Bible. This of course is where we find out who He is, what He's like and how He wants us to live, be, trust, praise and glorify Him. So, here is priority number one...

## **PERSONAL DEVOTIONS**

Over the years one of my favorite questions to campers has been "What did you have for devotions this morning?" The most common answer has been "I didn't have them." This is a shame to the walker with God. The one who walks close to the Lord has a consistent devotional life. Devotions are that special time during the morning, day or night that you spend with your Lord. It may be a prayer time, praise time, repenting time, Bible time, thanksgiving time or even a quiet time! The common theme of devotions is time spent with your Lord. In the book of Acts we read of the Bereanites in chapter 17 that searched the scriptures "daily". This is a great daily habit for any Christian that really cares about their walk with the Lord. Psalms is a compilation of men of God's devotions. They are songs of response of God's working in their lives. Every aspect of life is thought about and talked about with the Lord. The common theme in Psalms is a close walk with the Lord. What should our quiet time look like when we have blown it bad? Check out Psalm 51 when David blew it real bad! What should our quiet time look like when we are concerned with what lies ahead? Choose from a number of Psalms that sees God as the only help! Psalm 46 for example. Someone who walks close to God learns to hear His voice and begins to obey the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is the person that brings our devotions to life! Are yours dull and dreary? Are they inconsistent? Are they as powerful as a wet Cheerio against a wall? Ask for the Holy Spirit's help so that this part of your life will be one of the most important things you ever do. The Lord Jesus took time to be with the Father many times. Some whole nights were spent with him. You trace any Man or Woman of God's life and you won't go too far before you see a consistent devotional life appear over and over and over again. The person working for any camp needs to have a good consistent devotional life with the Lord to effectively impact people for eternity. The Lord equips us, empowers us, gives discernment to us, gives His compassion, love, heart for people as we spend time with Him. Be devotioned up before coming to counselor training. Ask God to enrich your life like never before in your time with Him. Get into that book. It is with the Lord and His book that you will have good success! Check it out in Psalms 1:1,2 and Joshua 1:8. His book the Bible is so important to be in. If time permits; read Psalm 119 in one sitting and look at this Psalmist devotional time that he had thinking about God's Word and what impact it has on his life. All but two or three of the verses mention God's word directly. Your devotional life may not be very consistent. It is not too late to start. Chuck Swindoll once said, "It's never too late to start doing what's right." I like that. Start a renewal in your devotional life today.

## THE MOUTH

Some are big and some are small and we all have one. It is called a mouth. The mouth is a great invention that can do a lot of things! It can eat, spit, talk, chew and spew! The counselor has a mouth and their mouth is to be used in a way that pleases the Lord. Paul told Timothy that as a young man he was to be an example to other believers in word. He also told the Ephesians to not let "any corrupt communication proceed out of their mouths but that which is good to the use of edifying, that it may minister grace to the hearers." The mouth was such an important topic that James gave a whole chapter to it in the book of James. Jesus gives us an insight when he said, "out of the abundance of the heart, the mouth speaks". People will know what is in our hearts by what we speak with our mouth. Oh, just a tidbit of information when dealing with kids. They usually don't fabricate their speeches and what they say gives us clear clues as to where their heart is and how we can help them. What does all this have to do with the counselor? About everything! What you say in seriousness and in fun impacts the hearers for a long time. Have you ever been teased? You have, you remember. Some things you heard as you were growing up still have a bite on you today. Have you ever been deeply touched by what someone said? You have, and you still remember today those things that were said. Think of when you became a Christian. Someone told you the message with their mouth and you responded and your life is totally changed just by a few words. Words said rightly are great things. Words said wrongly have just as much impact the other way. As a counselor your talk is to be upright! Pleasing to the Lord's ear. No gossip, talking behind the back, talking down the leadership, slander, swearing and all those other words that have that dark side to it.

Other things to watch out for are what we say about Hollywood. Some counselors in the past have had little control in their viewing and gaming lives and have seen the latest in the movie world. They talk of the neat things in the movie but forget quickly about the perverted parts and low language and violence and sexual defilements. So, a camper hears you talk of the show and says with in their heart. "Oh, the counselor watches that so it must be OK for me too!" The point is that with your mouth you gave the camper the impression that the "whole" show was OK for a Christian to watch. We need to lead by example and ask the Lord to help our mouths be pleasing to Him.

Mouth Habits are important to check out. One habit we have observed among many Christians is the use of euphemisms. Euphemism, besides being a big ugly word; this is where we say a word like "Gee" which in short form stands for "Jesus". So indirectly we say the Lord's name in a vain way. I know as well as any that some may think that we are splitting hairs. I would just ask you to check out your habits in vocabulary and see if you are full of euphemisms and consider changing some of those word habits before coming to camp. One year I used the word "Dog" lots. One camper figured that I used dog because it was god spelled backwards. So, out of kindness for that individual we did not use dog at that camp. I think we used cat. The point is to allow God control of the mouth on a daily bases. Oh, should I mention that a personal devotional life that is on the ball really helps us be in control our mouths! "Set a guard O Lord, over my mouth; Keep watch over the door of my lips." Psalm 141.3

## CONDUCT OR BEHAVIOUR

We are to have conduct that pleases the Lord. This includes every area of our lives. The Bible says we are to “Seek first His Kingdom and His RIGHTEOUSNESS...”. When was the last time you or I were called a righteous person. The Bible also uses the word godly for our conduct. In 1 Peter 1.15-16 we read “but as He who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct, because it is written “Be holy, for I am holy.”” It doesn’t get much clearer than that now does it. 1 Corinthians tells us that whatever we do is to glorify God. Colossians tells us to do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus. The point is very clear. We are to live holy lives.

You the counselor are to have this holiness going on in your life now before you come to camp. Does it make sense to start living a holy lifestyle when you show up to be a counselor? Of course not! Righteous, clean, good, wholesome conduct will be the order of every day we are at camp and away from camp. The Lord is to be pleased in all areas of our lives. In what we watch (movies, TV, pictures, magazines, internet, people, face- book, cellphones) and in what we hear (music, jokes, gossip, slander, government bashing, swearing and low talk) and in what we say (check out mouth section) and in what we do (dates, drink, habits, activities, entertainment) holiness and righteousness ought to be priority.

A friend of mine was talking to a camper that had attended their camp one summer. He asked if he was coming back to camp again. The reply was “No, I’m too scarred.” Upon further investigation it was found out that the camper was given a swirly. This is where he was held upside down in a toilette while it was flushed. The culprits that did this were counselors at the camp. Counselors that claimed they were Christians. Where was their holiness and righteousness? Do these qualities take a break when we do things with our campers? If these counselors had any heart for God they would not have done this at all. Now the damage is done. A camper is scarred to come back to camp and may be lost for eternity because of the un- righteous deeds of those that claim that Jesus Christ is Lord of their lives. How sad when I hear of campers getting wedgies, counselors expulsing gas near their faces, put downs, locking individuals in the outhouse, making fun of someone, looking places where one should not look causing the Lord to be grieved.

Fun is to be righteous fun. It is to be a fun that pleases Jesus: a conduct and lifestyle where pure fun is the most fun. As the Director of Camp Little Red I am the first to admit of the many failures in this area of my life. Praise the Lord for His forgiveness and restoration. We must pray for each other that our conduct would please the Lord first and not our- selves.

Let us strive to be holy in all our conduct as the Word of God says to do. Oh yes. Did you know that a truly good devotional life helps us to accomplish a holy conduct? The better our time with God = the better our righteous conduct because God changes our heart. When the heart changes so does the conduct. We end up changing from the inside out!

## **MODESTY**

Modesty is something that goes right along with conduct. While conduct seems to be a real problem with the guys, modesty is a problem for the girls. Not just the camper girls but also the counselor girls once in awhile show lack of godly taste in what they wear. There is a whole problem in our North American culture called Hollywoodizing. This is where people use the media to push a certain way of conducting oneself in public and private. Girls as young as 8 are dressing up like the latest star. Fashion has taken a whole devious twist to help pervert the minds of men, young men, boys, women, young women and girls into a worldly way of dressing, thinking and acting. The Bible says "Whatsoever we do in word or deed, let it be done to the glory of God." The Bible talks to women specifically in 1 Peter 3:3-4 "Do not let your adornment be merely outward-arranging the hair, wearing gold, or putting on fine apparel- rather let it be the hidden person of the heart, with the incorruptible beauty of a quiet and gentle spirit, which is very precious in the sight of God." The writer of Proverbs is quite clear when he says that "Charm is deceitful and beauty is passing, But a woman who fears the Lord, she shall be praised." All through Proverbs you find different kinds of woman that entice men to defile themselves with them. An uncontrolled desire for love turned to selfish lust and the down hill slide continues from there. All our clothing, make up, walk, conduct and thought life are to be under the control of the Holy Spirit so that we live Holy lives in all these areas! What does this have to do with being a camp counselor or worker? About everything! You see: the camp counselor knows ahead of time that God has made us sexual creatures. They will know that guys are turned on by sight and by touch. So, because they know this they will not be wearing stuff that could cause problems for their fellow staff. They will know that some girls are turned on by how they are treated, talked to and on the odd occasion how someone looks at or touches them. So, because they know this they will be above board in their communications with them. They will be discerning in how they act and dress. They especially will be able to help some of the campers that are very worldly in their ways and dress, to help them change in more ways than one! Clothes yes! Heart hopefully!

This is not new to you. If your going to counsel you should have this area of your life under submission to the Lord already... before you come to camp. Oh, by the way. Did you know that a consistent devotional life would help immensely in this area of your life? As you walk close to the Lord you will become more like him in your thinking, which translates even to the way you dress! Modesty is a high standard for the Christian.

## **DATING RELATIONSHIPS**

She was a counselor at camp. It was on the last day that her boyfriend came. It was just before the end of the camp. She was walking up the road with him hand in hand in the sight of all. There were campers, parents and other staff present while she did this action. What was the impact of her actions? Let me share with you what was observed. During the week she had campers around her continually. They were vying for her attention. She had really no distractions and was able to pour out a whole lot of love on them. However, after her boyfriend arrived on the scene and was holding her hand it was like a good repellent. Campers stayed away to give them space. Staff felt awkward and parents of the campers were able to see one of the girl counselors that was suppose to be dedicated to their kids. It was not a good scene. This counselor was an oddball counselor because she was shared with about the situation that happened. She and her boyfriend talked and realized that they were taking liberties that they should not be taking. Not only at camp but also outside of camp they lived

out higher standards of their relationship. There was no problem with her or him the rest of that summer or since. They are now married and I believe with a clear conscience because of root decisions made at camp. What does this mean for the camp worker? Does it mean "No Relationships Allowed." Of course not! What better place to meet a growing Christian other than in the winning of kids to Christ? How beautiful a set up to really get to know the other person in the camp situation. You get to see how they react to things positive and negative. You get to see their heart at high points and low points. You drop your guard so they can see the real you in all your beauty and in all your ugly. What we do discourage is when your relationship takes priority over the children and other staff at the camp. This kind of selfishness is nasty and not very productive. The focus is the Lord, the staff, the campers and their parents and then he or she! There are only 41 days of actual camp days to work. Surely any relationship can handle 41 days of self-control and Christlike service to the campers rather than to each other. There have been counselors sent home in the past for their poor handling of this area of their lives. This area of our lives should be "with it" before you come to camp. You need to have this area under the control of the Holy Spirit today so that when you come to camp it will not be a problem.

There are other poor examples that can be shared of half-hearted attempts to use self-control in this area. The flirting between the two counselors was obvious to the staff as well as the campers. It was awful to watch them neglect their charge while batting eyes at each other at the table. Walking together down the road. Little things and that's during the day. Then, to top it off when camp was over they were together so much in the physical department that a camper came up to them to share how disappointed they were to have them for an example in the area of dating. What a flop? Don't be a flop in your life, especially when doing the task of counseling kids that have been entrusted to your care by their parents. It's called responsibility! Take it well. By the way, did you know that a good consistent devotional life helps in this whole area? Devotions on the personal level are so important!

## **MUSIC**

Music at Camp Little Red is mostly conservative. Some of the modern contemporary songs are not part of the camp at this time. We do the 1st Corinthians thing and try to have all the music glorify God. We do incorporate new songs if they pass the scriptural tests of Philippians 4.8 and other such verses. As well, the Director has a major say in the music end of things since he is responsible to the Lord and the Camp Board. There were some former counselors that brought some songs to camp and we still sing them today. They are very God honoring, understandable and worshipping to the Lord songs. Some were fun songs and we sing them too. However, some were very fleshly and took the kids more away from the Lord rather than to Him. Parts of other songs are just plain fun! If you have musical talents or singing ability then please inform the Director and we shall see about incorporating you into the music end of things. Oh yes, personal daily devotions help tremendously in this area.

## **CONCLUSION**

The conclusion of the matter is really the beginning. We are in process of becoming more like the Lord in all our ways. We must be close to Him to be like Him. What matters is your heart. Will you pray for the Lord to help you become like David who was a man after God's own heart. As you get this kind of heart you will be a great counselor to the campers and an example to other believers in many areas of your life.

Pray for your summer at camp. Pray for the campers that will be in your charge. Pray for the Director. Pray for you. Have extra devotions with the Lord a month before camp starts.

P.S. It would be highly advised that you take a first aid training course of some type before coming to camp. Saint Johns Ambulance or the Red Cross run a Standard First Aid course in your area of residence I am sure.
